


Ardrossan Antics

The new crab cooking facilities have proved to be successful so we will be installing another two stations in the same design in the park.


Lawn and planting have been installed in front of the new villas and has made a big difference to the ambience to the villas.

Hi Everyone

A Police Report has been compiled for us outlining incidents in our region over the past two months:

2 nd Apl	Ardrossan business had approx. \$200 of empty cans stolen from the yard.
2 nd ApI	A male was arrested at Price for a parole board warrant. He was later charged with Serious Criminal Trespass and Theft from a business premise in Adelaide and then Theft using force, possessing a firearm and ammunition without a licence, drive disqualified, unassigned plates and several other traffic matters in connection with another business premises.
2 nd Apl	A female at Price was reported for hinder police, possess prohibited weapon and possessing
	equipment used in connection with drugs. She was later arrested for Theft using force, Possess
	firearm and ammunition without a licence, and arson of a motor vehicle.
15 th Apl	Police attended a vehicle crash involving 2 trucks at Port Arthur. No serious injuries were
	sustained. Enquiries are still continuing to the cause of the crash.
30 th Apl	Ardrossan Police assisted Maitland Police with the arrest of a male as a result of a domestic
	dispute at Maitland for unlawful threats and possessing a firearm and ammunition without a
	licence. Further enquiries conducted, resulted in a search at Balgowan being conducted and a
	male being reported for insecure firearm and ammunition, possessing unregistered firearms,
	and providing a firearm to an unlicenced person.
3 rd May	A male was arrested in Ardrossan for unlawful threats towards police.
3 rd May	Overnight in Port Clinton, a vehicle was stolen from a house yard. It was later seen in Smith-field where the person failed to pay for fuel.
4 th May	A male was arrested at Pine Point as a result of a domestic dispute for Aggravated Assault
4 May	causing harm.
13th May	A male was arrested at Tiddy Widdy Beach as a result of a domestic dispute for Aggravated
Totil iviay	assault with a weapon, Breaching an Intervention Order, Threats to kill, Unlawful Possession,
	Drive Disqualified and having false plates on a vehicle.

The above is a disturbing mix of theft, assault, possession of firearms/weapons, and drugs.

We are fortunate we have our police actively working for us, but it pays to be aware of your surroundings and of what is going on around you. **Remember** to report anything unusual as it may just help.

Let's hope we start to see more rain coming down now that we are in our winter months.

We're finding it difficult to find time to do the things we'd like to do, but we're getting there. Our members are involved in lots of different things, and it's amazing what work they get through. The blokes are always up for something new that they can get involved in.

We are also often surprised by the popularity of some of the things we have made. Some illustrations of this are the jigsaw tables we 've made, started out with one being made by a member for his wife and now we've lost count of how many that have been done. One of our members made a little fork-lift along with some pallets to go with it, now made dozens of pallets to be used as drink coasters. The same happens with all sorts of things that we never expected to be so popular. And the range of things we've been able to do with our CNC (computerised laser and router) machines is growing exponentially.

The biggest example of this is the Osprey nest stands we've been building. We started making four, then another 3, then another 4; having made 11 we thought that would be the end of it – not so. We're now making another 4 with 2 more to come after that. The below platforms have been manufactured to create new breeding sites this season on Eyre Peninsula

We're getting pretty good at it now, refined how we do things, made patterns so as not having to remeasure everything, and made tools to make it easier. And we're never short of enthusiasm with everyone willing to do whatever needs to be done.

The success of this program has been amazing, giving the endangered Osprey sea eagles a chance to breed up their numbers and steer them away from extinction and we are proud that what we have done has made a difference.

The biggest thing we've undertaken is the extension to our Shed that will provide space for the new welding workshop (already in full use), provide a larger meeting/lunchroom/event room, and a disabled toilet facility that we've had in mind for ages that can be used for members and visitors that need assistance and facilities to expand their inclusion in our community.

Since costs are a major factor in progression, we've needed to do as much as we can ourselves where possible, so it's going to take a bit more time to achieve what we want to do.

All of these projects take time and we've had to prioritise what we've been doing so the extension has taken a back seat for the moment – as much as we'd like to get on with it there's only so many hours in a day to do things.

Those not involved in the larger projects are finding plenty to do and are producing some really great stuff, doing things they've never had the chance to do before, appreciating the company of others and enjoying themselves in the process.

Membership is growing and we're running out of space in the old tearoom to accommodate all those who come along. The new lunchroom will improve that immensely.

The lack of working space and overcrowding has always been a drawback and a disincentive for members to join in at times. We hope to improve that when the extension is completed and we can reorganise and improve the available space, planned features, and the experiences we want to provide for our members.

The generosity of the townspeople and the business in town never ceases to amaze us and offers keep coming in. We are particularly pleased that people assist in what we are doing. We try to support the townsfolk, organisations, and businesses in as many ways as we can – as they do us!

We have learnt a great deal since we started the

Shed in mid-2016 and hope with our new facilities, to be able to involve more of our community in what we are doing. A great deal of work to do yet to help ourselves, and our community ahead of us. That makes what we are trying to do worthwhile.

We are open every Monday and Thursday, 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. You can drop in any time you like and we are sure you will find it a broad experience to be a part of our friendly team. The kettle is always on!

- Should you have any questions in relation to the NDIS program or Carers' respite, please contact the hospital and ask to speak to Narita.

We are working now to involve some additional community people to immediately continue our campaign for reinstated or improved health services that could be based in our existing health centre.

Thank you to you all for your patience with this process. I will keep you updated as we progress.

We are writing to you on behalf of the Ardrossan and Sport and Recreation committee. An inspection of the courts by Netball SA located on the corner of Maitland Road and West Terrace has revealed they require resurfacing. They were established in 2006 and have only required minimal maintenance over the past 16 years. The conditions causing concern are cracked and lifting lines as well as the asphalt base itself. These issues can attribute to slipping/tripping injuries.

These courts are used all year round by the local Basketball Club who have 65+ registered players/members for the 23/24 Season, Netball Club who have 80+ Registered players/members for the 2024 season and Tennis Club who have currently gone into recess. Additionally, these are currently the only courts used by our wider local community and tourists, that are in reasonable condition in Ardrossan.

We have had 2 companies able to come and measure and quote for us. The first company Ace Bitumen were the ones who originally laid the hotmix back in 2006. The quote has come in with the estimated cost of \$47360.00 (base) and \$3450.00 (lines) all subject to change not including GST. The next quote was provided by Pro Bitumen and they have provided three quotes ranging from \$62660.95 - \$89212.20 not including GST, subject to change, this quote does not include the Hotmix and Labour costs for the lines.

Sport and Rec can fund this project with \$10,000.00, The Netball, Basketball and Tennis clubs have contributed a total of \$17,500.00. We have had success with 2 grant applications and have been granted \$8000.00 in total. We have been fundraising for over 2 years and have had many catering functions and have raised \$4662.00. Donations and sponsorship so far \$9933.00. That leaves a balance of \$8905.00 remaining to raise with using the quote from Ace Bitumen.
